Did you know? • Russia and the Seletun Scientific statement recommends that U18's and pregnant women do not use cell phones • Taiwan removed all telecom masts (1500) from or near schools in 2007 • Switzerland and France have removed WiFi from schools and replaced it with fibre optic • Schools worldwide have removed WiFi and ensured they are hard wired • India prohibits the use of children or women in cell phone advertisements • France has prohibited the use of WiFi in its public libraries and some cities have removed WiFi completely.

The World Health Organisation has classified radiofrequency electromagnetic fields as possibly carcinogenic to humans. The European Parliament has advised its 47 member states to put in place information and awareness campaigns on the risks of the long term biological effects of EMFs, especially targeting children, teenagers and young people of reproductive age.

The Electromagnetic Radiation Research Foundation was formed to research the latest medical papers and policies in other countries, where the public are being protected and disseminate that information to the relevant officials, public, media and schools.
